

Alabama Author Mike Burrell takes readers on a wild roller coaster ride through the land of an insane Elvis cult.

Livingston, Alabama – Just in time for Elvis month (August) and the 50th anniversary of the King's '68 Comeback TV Special, Livingston Press releases *The Land of Grace*.



When a beautiful young woman takes Elvis impersonator Doyle Brisendine to a replica of Graceland, he first thinks he's landed in some kind of amusement park staffed with actors playing characters from Elvis' life, including some of Elvis's relatives, the Memphis Mafia, and an impersonator who looks like Elvis in his last days. But Doyle quickly learns that he's in the midst of a zealous cult built around the worship of the King, led by a ruthless high priestess called Mama. Since childhood, Doyle has secretly dreamed of being Elvis. Soon he'll have to decide if he's willing to pay a very high price to become the King of Rock and Roll.
